**Sports Concussions:  
Separating Myths from Facts**

Sports-related concussions represent a significant problem in all levels of athletic participation from early community and intramural athletics to professional sports. The management of sports-related concussions must begin with educating the student athletes, their parents, and school personnel about the symptoms and management of concussions. This will allow the identification of student athletes who have sustained a concussion and facilitate proper management of symptoms to help him/her recover as fully as possible, and safely return to play and full-time academics.

Dr. Angelone is a clinical neuropsychologist practicing in Marin County for the last 20 years. He is a Diplomat in neuropsychology by the American Board of Professional Neuropsychology and a Fellow of the American College of Professional Neuropsychology. He is an Assistant Clinical Professor at University of California San Francisco, Medical School. He is also former Chief of Psychology, Marin General Hospital. His areas of expertise include: Sport Concussions, and assessment and treatment of Dementia. He is a member of the American Psychological Association Division of Aging, and Division of Neuropsychology, the National Academy of Neuropsychology.
